Missions and Outreach Ministry

In July 2011, five mission-minded members of PVS accompanied me on a Vision Trip to Lahuaytambo. Peru, a remote village located 11,000 feet up in the Andes Mountains. Our purpose was to determine if the Lord was leading us to adopt this Unreached Micro People Group as our own. After spending a few days among the people of Lahuaytambo and asking the Lord for His guidance, we agreed to return to PVS with a recommendation to adopt the Huanca Quechua People Group of Lahuaytambo. On July 10, 2011, you voted in unanimous affirmation of our recommendation. Nine years and fifteen mission trips later, we have been eyewitnesses to the Lord's work among the people resulting in seven salvations and numerous hearts softened to the Gospel. We've conducted Medical Clinics, Vision Clinics, Dental Clinics, and Children's Bible Clubs, demonstrated the construction of water purifiers and rocket stoves, worked alongside the locals in their fields and repaired their terraces and spent countless hours in the Lahuaytambo schools teaching the children English through Bible Storying. The relationships we've formed will last into eternity. In celebration of this Christ-honoring ministry and the work the Lord has accomplished in and through us there, we will be returning to Lahuaytambo one last time the week of July 11-19.
