Sheriff Mark Herford, Chaplain Jim Cheever, and the other officers and employees of the Beauregard Parish Sheriff's Office in DeRidder, Louisiana, asked me to thank you for your outpouring of support through your donations to RomeGaCares. You will never know how much your donations meant, and will continue to mean, to the people in the area whose lives have been turned upside-down by this disaster. When we arrived Monday evening with two semi-trailers and two U-Haul trucks filled with supplies, we found the Collection Center, manned by Beauregard Parish Sheriff's Office employees and Louisiana National Guard troops, virtually empty. On Tuesday, we saw firsthand the devastation left by Hurricane Laura's Category 4 winds in DeRidder and throughout Beauregard Parish. Over the next three days we were able to tarp sixteen roofs, clear downed trees and debris, and distribute supplies into remote areas of the parish. Above all, we had the blessing of sharing the Good News with many people the Lord placed in our paths. We are praying and trusting the Lord that our efforts will result in many salvations and changed lives. Please continue to pray for the people of Beauregard Parish as they work to restore their homes and lives.
