Concerning our scheduled trip to Peru April 4-11, I am disappointed to inform you that it has been cancelled due to a prevailing extreme level of COVID-19 status in Lima, and the fact that our primary village of Lahuaytambo continues to be closed to outsiders. Raul, our ministry partner in Peru, has been in contact with village officials who tell him that there is no plan to open up the village to outsiders until the situation in Lima shows some drastic improvement. On a brighter note, the Ukraine Mission scheduled for June 4-12 is still ago. Pray that the virus situation here and in Ukraine will continue to improve so we can safely return to partner with our Ukrainian Brothers and Sisters-in-Christ. This year we'll be sharing the Gospel through Medical and Vision Clinics in the remote villages of the Kharkiv Region in eastern Ukraine. I am also excited to inform you that a construction mission team will be leaving March 7 for a week of ministry in Hazard, Kentucky. We will be working with Pastor Tim Reynolds and the members of the First Baptist Church of Hazard renovating their kitchen and fellowship hall. Time is short, so let me know ASAP if you are interested in this mission to the mountains of eastern Kentucky.
