The ministry of PVS kids is entering an extremely busy time of planning and preparing for upcoming spring and summer events, perusing and choosing new curriculum for the fall, deciding about possible classroom restructuring, and many other things that

occupy our time and thoughts. And while our minds and bodies are busy at work, our hearts are always tuned to the what, how, and why of children's ministry. We want to always be mindful of our foremost goal at PVS kids and that is to lead children to a saving knowledge of Jesus. One way of doing this is by providing resources for parents to teach their children about God and how to share their own faith within their family. We want children to be more than morally good. Strong character and sound morals are important, but without a personal relationship and a deep understanding of what God has provided for them through His Son, Jesus, our children are just "good" kids. A PVS kids ministry volunteer recently shared a quote with me from J. Gerald Harris which was published in the Feb. 2023 edition of *Decision* Magazine: "If we (parents) don't teach our children to follow Christ, the world will teach them not to." Here are a few simple ideas to help parents and other caregivers begin to share the Gospel message with their children:

Share your own personal salvation story. Let your child see real faith in action.

- Reinforce that the Bible is true. It is God's Word to us. Find a good children's Bible and read a section each day. Tell them how the Bible helps you in your daily life and memorize Scripture appropriate for their age.
- Model for your kids the process of conviction and repentance. Let them know that you are sinful, too, and God forgives you when you fail. Don't focus on perfection, but instead focus on God's grace.
- Spend time with the Lord. Talk to Jesus while they're listening. Pray for your children and let them see and hear you praying. Keep your prayers simple. Let them hear you express your needs and also model worship through prayer.
- Talk about Jesus with your children as you go through the day. Waiting in the car drop-off line, sitting in the doctor's waiting room, running errands around town, walking in the park, these are all prime opportunities to talk about God, Jesus, creation, and other spiritual matters.
