Praise God for a great Student Fusion mission trip to Arlington, Texas! It was hot. The drive was long. IT WAS WORTH IT!

Mission Arlington takes church to the people. The massive organization has over 300 mission church plants in apartment complexes around the DFW Metroplex. We served in two complexes while there. One had an established church. The other will have a new church plant in a few weeks. Our work was a mix of strengthening an existing church, and helping plant a new one. At our main site, we distributed food daily to families in need.

The mission has used its "Rainbow Express" Bible club model to minister to children and families for over three decades. Here is an excerpt from the Mission Arlington newsletter about last summer's Rainbow Express results:

Children love and look forward to Rainbow Express.® Last year, more than 17 thousand (17,147) children participated. One hundred sixteen (116) student groups from 11 states and 38 Texas cities led these four-day events in 271 locations across our community. The children had so much fun! The spiritual impact of Rainbow Express® is significant. Last year, 455 children opened their hearts to the Lord, starting their brand-new journey of faith.

Our students led every aspect of our Rainbow Express site. All of them shared their personal testimonies in a large-group and small-group setting. They all did a terrific job! Our adults mentored the students in every aspect of the Bible club, doing whatever was needed to proclaim Jesus.

We rejoiced that our own Mary Rains made her faith public during the trip, and then came forward to celebrate with our church the Sunday after we returned home. We also rejoice that another one of our students, Benji Drummond, led a 9-year-old boy named Kaydence to faith in Jesus at an Arlington apartment complex. We are so excited about what God has done, and how this will lead to greater things for all of these students in the future!
